

810-1-2-.03 Public Hearings. (REPEALED)

(1) An oral hearing in connection with a proposed rulemaking action will be scheduled as indicated in the Notice of Proposed Rulemaking. The hearing shall be conducted by the Secretary, of his designee. Such hearing may be held in Montgomery, Alabama, or at such other convenient location as the Secretary may designate, and shall be recorded by mechanized means or by a qualified shorthand reporter. A summary of the proceedings shall be placed in the record maintained by the Secretary, together with the Secretary's decision and findings in connection with the proposed rulemaking.

(2) All interested persons who desire to make an oral presentation at the hearing shall give notice to the Secretary at least seven (7) days prior to the hearing date, advising the substance of the proposed oral presentation, the estimated time needed for the presentation, and any other information necessary for the orderly scheduling of the hearing. Any person who desires to make an oral presentation at the hearing without having given the notice to the Secretary required by this rule may be allowed to participate in the manner and to the extent determined by the Secretary in his discretion.

(3) The Secretary will establish an agenda for the hearing, and will advise all participants at the beginning of the hearing of the order of presentations and the time allowed to each. The hearing may be continued or adjourned to such time and place as the Secretary deems advisable.
