ALABAMA ADMINISTRATIVE CODE ALABAMA DEVELOPMENT OFFICE, ADMINISTRATIVE CODE CHAPTER 281-4-1. THE ALABAMA INNOVATION FUND

Chapter 4-1-.01

281-4-1-.01 Definitions

As used in this chapter, the following terms shall have the following meanings:

- (1) "ACCELERATE ALABAMA" means the economic development strategic plan for the State of Alabama developed by the Alabama Economic Development Alliance created by Executive Order No. 21 issued by Governor Robert Bentley...
- (2) "COMMERCE" means the Alabama Department of Commerce.
- (3) "ALABAMA INNOVATION FUND" means that fund described in Section 281-X-3-01 of the Alabama Administrative Code below,
- (4) "APPLICANT" means a Public University which submits a qualifying Application.
- (5) "APPLICATION" means an Application for research and development from the Alabama Innovation Fund.
- (6) "EPSCoR" means the Experimental Program to Stimulate Competitive Research.
- (7) "GENERALLY ACCEPTED ACCOUNTING PRINCIPLES" means those conventions, rules and procedures that constitute accepted accounting practices in the United States, as determined by the Financial Accounting Standards Board and any successor organization thereto that is charged with the promulgation of such conventions, rules and procedures
- (8) "PERSON" means a natural person or other entity, including without limitation a corporation, general or limited partnership, trust or limited liability company.
- (9) PROJECT means a research and development project for which funding has been requested pursuant to this chapter.
- (10) "REASONABLE" means fair, proper, just or suitable under the circumstances.
- (11) "PUBLIC UNIVERSITY" means a public four year university established by the State and operating within Alabama.
- (12) "SECRETARY" means the Secretary of Commerce.
- (13) STATE" means the State of Alabama.

181-4-1-02 The Alabama Innovation Fund

As part of the implementation of Accelerate Alabama, the State of Alabama has created the Alabama Innovation Fund. The purpose of this fund is to maximize the use of the State's economic development resources by leveraging annual research and development expenditures by Public Universities within the State to generate resources which can be used to support economic development initiatives. The Alabama Innovation Fund shall support and operate two (2) distinct programs. They are:

- (1) The Renewal Program Sixty percent (60%) of the annual funding available to the Alabama Innovation Fund, net of expenses, shall be used to fund the Renewal Program. These funds shall be distributed through grants to Public Universities which submit an Application under this chapter. The allocation to each Public University which makes application shall be based on each Public University's federally financed research and development expenditures as reported by the National Science Foundation in its publication entitled "Surveys of Research and Development Expenditures at Colleges and Universities". Each Public University's expenditures as reported by the National Science Foundation over the immediately preceding three (3) fiscal years shall be used to determine such Public University's respective allocation. Each Public University submitting an Application shall receive an amount that reflects that institution's percentage of such expenditures in relation to expenditures reported by the National Science Foundation to all Public Universities which make an Application.
- (2) The Research Program Forty percent (40%) of the annual funding available to the Alabama Innovation Fund, net of expenses, shall be used to fund the Research Program. These funds shall be distributed, in keeping with the State's goals to stimulate economic development as set out in Accelerate Alabama, to Public Universities who submit an Application through a competitive process described in this chapter. The criteria used in making awards shall include without limitation:

The likelihood of a Project to create patentable or other proprietary innovative technology capable of successful commercialization.

The likelihood of a Project to stimulate further research and development within the State.

The likelihood of a Project to contribute directly or indirectly to the creation of additional jobs within the State.

Expertise of the research team in fields which would contribute to the success of a Project,

Participation by the research team in past projects of a similar nature which have led to successful commercialization and related job creation.

The amount of useful technological, economic, human and intellectual property resources available to the research team, and

The likelihood of the Project to contribute in positive way to the State's economy.

231-4-1-.03 Application.

In order to qualify for a receipt of funds under either the Renewal Program or Research Program each Public University shall submit an Application annually in the form prescribed by the Secretary in the manner set out below:

- (1) Applications shall be signed and certified as to accuracy by a senior official of each Applicant. Each Application shall be submitted by hand or by certified mail to Alabama Department of Commerce, Alabama Center for Commerce, 401 Adams Avenue, Suite 670 Montgomery, Alabama 36104, Attention: Secretary of Commerce. Applications shall be submitted no later than 9:00 a.m. (Montgomery, Alabama time) on May 31 of each year.
- (2) An Application shall be considered received by COMMERCE when COMMERCE receives three (3) originals of the Application, each of which is complete in all material respects. COMMERCE shall stamp Applications received by COMMERCE with the date and time of receipt by COMMERCE. Late applications and those applications found by COMMERCE to be materially incomplete shall be considered as not having been filed with COMMERCE and shall be returned by COMMERCE to the applicant by mail in which case the COMMERCE shall have no further obligation to provide additional notices to the applicant:
- (3) A completed Application shall include the following:
 - (i) The name of the Public University making Application and the name and full contact information of the Applicant's contact for purposes of that Application.
 - (ii) A detailed description of each Project, its goals and estimated total cost of each Project for which funds requested from the Renewal Program and Research Program respectively shall be used.
 - (iii) A description of other funding available for the Applicant's respective Projects and the source of that funding.
 - (iv) The names and a detailed description and supporting documentation of the experience of each natural person who will direct and/or conduct each respective project for which funding is sought under the Renewal and Research Programs respectively. Such descriptions and supporting documents shall be certified as accurate by each natural person listed the following and shall include the following:
 - (A) A detailed resume with a listing of references including full contact information for each reference; and
 - (B) A listing of all professional certifications and degrees held by each natural person who will direct and/or conduct each respective project for which funding is sought or similar projects. A statement shall be included as to whether each professional certification is active and in good standing.
 - (v) A description of similar successful projects directed or conducted by the Applicant.

- (VI) The attainment to date of goals related on Projects for which funding is sought by the Applicant.
- (vii) The number of and a description of other non-confidential research and development projects in which the Applicant is currently involved.
- (viii) The annual dollar amount of expenditures as reported by the National Science foundation in the immediately preceding three (3) fiscal years.
- (ix) A listing and description of any patents, copyrights, trademarks or other intellectual property rights held by the Applicant which are related to the scope of work of the Project or the Applicant otherwise feels would be helpful in evaluating its Application (inclusive of any applicable identifying numbers, governmental agency of issuance, and geographic region covered). Indicate whether or not a member of the research team developed the underlying technology and how, if at all, such intellectual property rights could be expected to contribute to the success of the Project.
- (x) An estimate of the number of jobs that Applicant estimates to be created by the successful completion of the Applicant's Project and an estimated timetable for and wage level of such jobs. Please provide any supporting data on which your projections are based.
- (xi) If the Project is anticipated to produce proprietary intellectual property rights, give an estimate, if practical to do so, of the value of licensing fees that could be obtained from such rights. Please provide any supporting data on which these projections are based.
- (xii) List any information that would help Commerce understand how the Project would contribute to achieving the goals of Accelerate Alabama and the specific goals outlined in Section 281-X-2-.04(2).
- (xiii) An affidavit and such other documentation as is deemed necessary by COMMERCE to establish that the Company is in compliance with all applicable federal, state and local laws, regulations and ordinances.
- (4) Any false, inaccurate, or misleading information provided in an Application submitted to COMMERCE may be grounds for rejection of an Application and denial of further consideration.
- (5) Whenever any material information that an Applicant supplied in its Application has become maccurate or obsolete, the Applicant shall immediately notify COMMERCE in writing and file an amended Application, including originally executed signature pages. Such amended Application shall be submitted within thirty (30) days of the information becoming inaccurate or obsolete during the Application process. Such amended Applications shall be filed in the same manner as the original Application.
- (6) COMMERCE reserves the right to determine what information is material regarding the completion, execution and whether the filing of an amended Application or a notification is required under this section. COMMERCE may request any such additional information from the Applicant as COMMERCE deems necessary to appropriately review an Application, amended Application or notification.

(7) In the event that an incomplete Application is submitted that is not considered materially complete by COMMERCE or additional information is requested by COMMERCE, COMMERCE shall notify the Applicant within a reasonable time after receipt of the Application. If an incomplete Application is not completed or the additional information is not supplied within a reasonable time, then COMMERCE may, in its discretion, deem the Application to not have been filed with the COMMERCE and return the Application to the Applicant by mail in which case the COMMERCE shall have no further obligation to provide additional notices to the Applicant.

281-4-1-.04 Application Review.

COMMERCE shall review each Application. COMMERCE may retain, and pay reasonable fees and expenses from funds of the Alabama Innovation Fund, a fund administrator (which shall perform those duties as prescribed by the Secretary). EPSCoR or another consultant or consultants and/or panel members to assist in the review of Applications, verification of information contained in Applications and development of more detailed criteria upon which grants from the Research Program may be made and evaluated. In order to gain a broader perspective of the relative value of competing research and development opportunities at Public Universities the Secretary may appoint panel members who will be asked for recommendations as to additional criteria which may be employed in determining how various Projects should be ranked. Such panel may, if so requested, also assist COMMERCE in the evaluation and ranking of Projects. A final decision as to the allocation of funds, if any, made to a particular Applicant shall be made by the Governor upon the recommendation of the Secretary.

If the total appropriation to the Alabama funovation fund in any fiscal year of the State, net of proration, is greater than five million and no hundredths dollars (\$5,000,000,00), distributions of funds to qualifying Applicants under either the Renewal Program or Research Program shall be made once per quarter on dates chosen at the discretion of COMMERCE. If the total appropriation to the Alabama Innovation Fund in any fiscal year of the State, net of proration, is equal to or less than five million and no hundredths dollars (\$5,000,000,00), distributions of funds to qualifying Applicants under either the Renewal Program or Research Program shall be made once per year on a date chosen at the discretion of COMMERCE.

No later than April 30 of each year any Applicant receiving grants under this chapter during the previous fiscal year shall submit a report in a form satisfactory to COMMERCE detailing the accomplishments and summarizing the expenditures during said fiscal year of each of the Applicant's Projects. Financial information provided shall be prepared and reported using Generally Accepted Accounting Principles. The Secretary may in his [or her] reasonable discretion require audits of any Project of any Applicant. By filing an Application each Public University agrees to make such reports on a timely basis and submit to audit as required by the Secretary.
