

Chapter 165-X-19 Types of Bout Results

165-X-19-.02 After Match, Contest or Exhibition

165-X-19-.01 Types of Bout Results

1. Submission

- (a) Tap Out: When a contestant physically uses his hand to indicate that he or she no longer wishes to continue.
- (b) Verbal tap out: When a contestant verbally announces to the referee that he or she does not wish to continue; or makes audible sounds such as screams indicating pain or discomfort.
- (c) Technical Submission: When a submission is executed to its completeness which cause the referee to intervene and stop the contest. Example, a choke causes a fighter to go unconscious, or a joint lock causes a fracture.

2. Technical knockout

- (a) Referee stops bout
- (b) Ringside physician stops bout
- (c) When an injury as a result of a legal maneuver is severe enough to terminate a bout

3. Knockout by failure to rise from the canvas.

4. Decision via score cards.

- (a) Unanimous: When all three judges score the bout for the same contestant
- (b) Split Decision: When two judges score the bout for one contestant and one judge scores for the opponent
- (c) Majority Decision: When two judges score the bout for the same contestant and one judge scores a draw

5. Types of Draws.

- (a) Unanimous - When all three judges score the bout a draw;
- (b) Majority - When two judges score the bout a draw; or
- (c) Split - When all three judges score differently and the score total results in a draw

6. Disqualification. When an injury sustained during competition as a result of an intentional foul is severe enough to terminate the contest.

7. Forfeit. When a contestant fails to begin competition or prematurely ends the contest for reasons other than injury or by indicating a tap out;

8. Technical Draw. When an injury sustained during competition as a result of an intentional foul causes the injured contestant to be unable to continue and the injured contestant is even or behind on the score cards at the time of stoppage; or; in Double Knockout Situations, the referee shall stop a contest or exhibition of unarmed combat at any stage if the referee determines that both unarmed combatants are in such a condition that to continue might subject the unarmed combatants to serious injury;

9. Technical Decision. When the bout is prematurely stopped due to injury and a contestant is leading on the score cards.

10. No Contest. When a contest is prematurely stopped due to accidental injury and a sufficient number of rounds have not been completed to render a decision via the score cards.

165-X-19-.02 After the Contest, Match, or Exhibition.

1. Contestants to Leave Ring. When the decision of the referee or judges has been announced both contestants and their corners shall at once leave the ring or cage and retire to their dressing rooms.
2. Decision Announcement. In all contests decided by the judges' scorecards, the announcer will announce if the decision is "unanimous," "a majority decision," or "a draw," and the total points given to each contestant by the three judges will be announced.
3. Finality of the Decision. A decision rendered at the end of any amateur mixed martial arts contest is final and shall not be changed unless the Athletic Commission determines that any of the following occurred:
 - (a) There was collusion or fraud affecting the result of any contest
 - (b) The compilation of the score cards of the referee and judges reveals a clerical or mathematical error which caused the decision to be given to the wrong amateur mixed martial artist.
 - (c) There was a violation of the laws or rules and regulations governing amateur mixed martial arts in this state which affected the results of any contest.

4. Appeal of Decision. A competitor may appeal the decision of the contest.
5. A petition to change a decision. A petition shall be in writing and filed by the contestants manager within five (5) business days from the date the decision was rendered.
6. Hearing procedures. The Alabama Athletic Commission may hold a hearing to change the decision or the ruling at any time within fourteen (14) days from the date the decision was written. A majority vote of the Athletic Commissioners shall be required prior to holding a hearing.
7. Change of individual fight results. If the Alabama Athletic Commission determines that any of the above occurred with regards to any contest then the decision rendered shall be changed as the Athletic Commission may direct, and shall notify the national registry of the change.
