# 488-X-1-.09 Exemptions.

- (1) The board may grant exemptions status from licensure or permitting for a period of 90 days for only the following reasons:
  - a) A catastrophic emergency, including protracted illness under the care of a physician, reasonable precludes the meeting of CEU requirements or compliance of testing in a timely manner to receive certification before March 15<sup>th</sup>. Failure to receive test results shall not be grounds for this exemption.
  - b) Unavailability of a test approved by the Board or lack of sufficient training and preparatory opportunities leading to testing.
  - e) Service by a military person on active duty in the Armed Forces of the United States. Which precludes them from reasonably completing the requirements for licensure or Permitting.

488-X-1-.09 Deaf Interpreter & Transliterator Exemption request
(1) A Deaf Interpreter and Transliterator Permit will be issued only to a person who is deaf. A Deaf Interpreter Permit may be obtained by submitting the following:

- (a) Notarized application for the Deaf Interpreter Permit.
- (b) One of the following:
  - (i) GED, High school Diploma or Certified transcripts or
  - (ii) College diploma or college certified transcripts
- (c) <u>Documentation from a licensed practicing physician stating that you are legally deaf, according to Federal Government Standards</u>
- (d) Proof of Citizenship and
- (e) Proof of citizenship form
